










# Deaths decreased 1.5 per cent

- A total of 47,964 deaths was recorded for the first quarter 2024, a decrease of 1.5 per cent as compared to the first quarter 2023 (48,693 deaths).
- First quarter of 2022 recorded the highest number of deaths as compared to the same quarter in the period of 2000 to 2024.

## Demographic Statistics by State, First Quarter 2024<sup>p</sup>, Malaysia





- > Selangor (21.6%), Johor (12.3%) and Sabah (11.0%) recorded high population in the first quarter 2024.
- > Selangor recorded the highest number of live births with 19,951 births (18.8%) while Wilayah Persekutuan Labuan recorded the lowest births with 323 births (0.3%).
- > In terms of death, Selangor recorded the highest number with 7,730 deaths (16.1%) while Wilayah Persekutuan Putrajaya recorded the lowest deaths with 68 deaths (0.1%).
